



## **Mira Costa College Articulated Coursework FAQ's**

### **What is an articulated high school course?**

All of our SDUHSD high school sites offer courses that are articulated with Mira Costa College. Articulation means that students in the course have the opportunity to receive both high school credit and community college credit for the course.

### **How do students ensure that they receive both high school and college credit for an articulated course?**

Students in articulated courses work with their high school teacher to enroll into MiraCosta College using the College's new student application. They then work with the high school teacher also to register for the articulated course in CATEMA, a system supported by the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office, which is where teachers will post final grades. All SDUHSD students must earn a B or better and receive recommendation for the credit from the high school instructor in an articulated course in order to earn the college course credit.

### **How do students request a transcript from Mira Costa College that shows my completed college level coursework?**

SDUHSD students should contact [Mira Costa College Admissions and Records Office](#) to request an official transcript. Please note, students must request a transcript within 3 years of completing the course, otherwise the coursework credits will not be valid.
