School Community, Curriculum & Academic Program

Torrey Pines High School is an exemplary institution within the high achieving San Dieguito Union High School District. The 2,600 students in grades 9-12 represent diverse communities in the coastal areas of northern San Diego County. Our mission is to be a dynamic community of lifelong learners who make significant contributions in our world. We strive to facilitate student growth so that they are self-directed learners, effective communicators, collaborative workers, quality producers, and world citizens who are active community participants. Most of all, we are committed to our TP Pledge.

Students take year-long classes and follow a semester schedule where they can take up to seven classes on an alternating day schedule in each 18-week fall and spring term. Each class is 100 minutes with one 55 minute period offered every day. The additional period creates flexibility and creates opportunities for specialized programs. Students earn a final grade each semester in all classes. Students who take 7 classes can earn up to 70 credits in a year. Yearlong classes create connections among students and staff. Student success is supported by tutoring programs on campus, 150 extracurricular student clubs, and the TPHS Parent Foundation. We also offer a comprehensive interscholastic athletics program with 26 varsity-level sports. Since 1974, TPHS scholar-athletes have earned 279 CIF championships including 28 CIF State and Regional titles, more than any other high school in San Diego County.

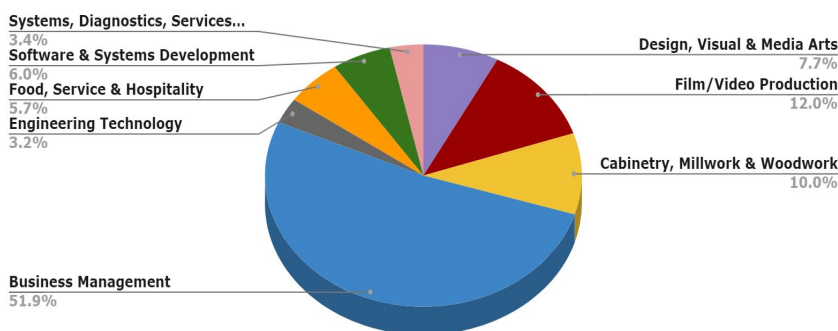

Torrey Pines High School offers students 8 career pathways that include the 11 elements of a high quality program. 16 CTE courses are college prep and 8 CTE courses articulate with our local community college, Mira Costa College, allowing students to earn college credit. In Spring 2022, 1,904 TPHS students participated in a CTE pathway and 357 TPHS students completed a CTE pathway, earning a CTE completer designation.

Distance Learning

2019-2020: In March 2020, all SDUHSD schools physically closed per county public health orders and transitioned to a distance learning plan following course essential learning outcomes due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. Credit/No Credit (CR/NC) marks were issued as the recommended grading system. To accommodate later requests, the option was added to apply for letter grades based on quarter 3 grades as a benchmark. To comply with "hold harmless," final term grades were based on the 3rd quarter grade which could only be improved by 4th quarter work. This change in grading policy only applied to Spring 2020 final term grades.

2020-2021: Per July 2020 Governor's order and continuing county guidance, all SDUHSD schools remained physically closed at the start of the fall term and a distance learning model with letter grades and full curriculum was implemented through the second quarter. Per CA Assembly Bill 104 (7/2021), all students in grades 9-12 in 2020-2021 were given the option to request to change any letter grades to CR/NC.

2021-2022: Per CA Assembly Bill 130 (7/2021), districts were temporarily required to offer an Independent Study option only to students whose health would be put at risk by in-person instruction, as determined by the parent or guardian. This included long-term and short-term Independent Study offerings via an online learning platform and letter grades were issued.

2022-2023: SDUHSD is offering a voluntary independent study online learning program option using Edgenuity coursework and asynchronous and synchronous instruction.
