Description

English 9 P is a yearlong course that include short stories, novels, autobiography, drama, poetry, expository texts, and grammar. Assignments including meaningful class discussions, journaling, creative projects, speeches, and theater arts are all incorporated into the curriculum. Students will gain an understanding of the fundamentals of literary analysis and learn to construct a multi-paragraph response to literature. Additionally, students will practice several other modes of writing including argument, narrative and creative. Students will develop critical thinking skills based on teacher modeling and will learn to apply these skills to their assignments, both independently and in cooperative learning groups. Expectations and Goals

Students entering English 9 should already have a good understanding of the following:

Reading:

- Comprehension and analysis of grade-level text
- Exposure to non-fiction, expository text
- Literary response and analysis

Writing:

- Paragraph structure
- Ability to write a process paper (multi paragraph essay)
- Develop main ideas with supporting evidence

Speaking:

- Support perspectives and judgments with convincing evidence
- Deliver presentations that incorporate technology

Grammar Conventions:

- Use varied sentence types
- Use parallelism to present items in a series
- Use subordination, coordination, apposition to indicate relationships between ideas Use correct punctuation, spelling and capitalization

Estimated Homework

A 9th grade College Prep English student should expect 10-15 pages of independent reading each class period, and/or approximately 60-120 minutes of homework per week. (A student's individual ability level and competency may affect the actual preparation times needed.)
