Course Description

College Preparatory (CP) United States History fulfills both state and district requirements for high school graduation. The course examines the nation's history from approximately the time of the American Revolution, with an emphasis on the Twentieth Century. Instruction is centered not on merely memorizing the events of American history, but on teaching students to critically analyze history in order to determine how the nation's past has influenced the present. Special attention is placed on analysis of cultural, political, and economic history—including technological advancements—using the District's "Big Ideas in U.S. History" as a framework. Building from the foundations established in the CP World History course, students in CP U.S. History continue the process of historical document analysis, eventually completing a document-based essay. Occasionally, the study of current events in American society will be infused through the curriculum in order to highlight connections to standards.

Grading

Teachers employ variations of either the weighted or the cumulative method for determining grades. However, the following scare is used to determine the final grade: 100% to 90% A; 89% to 80% B; 79% to 70% C; 69% to 60% D; 59% and below F
