French I

Readiness Profile & Course Expectations

Prerequisite: A desire to learn the language and culture of French speaking countries.

Course General Description:

Experience has shown that successful French students come to class ready to learn with a positive attitude an open mind as well as a willingness to ask questions, speak, read, write and listen at a novice level. The French I course places an emphasis on correct pronunciation, listening comprehension, vocabulary development, the fundamentals of verb conjugations, and the formation of simple, complete and grammatically correct French sentences.

Student Background:

Students entering *FRENCH I* should have a command of the following concepts:

- English Grammar: noun, adjective, verb, pronoun, adverb, conjunction, etc.
- English sentence and paragraph structure

Students entering *FRENCH I* should also be able to do the following things:

Have the maturity/social skills to speak a language different than English or another native language and accept cultural differences. Students will keep a well-organized notebook, take notes, listen to language tapes, work independently and in groups and make oral French presentations. Listening and speaking are practiced both in-class and in the Language Listening Laboratory. Additionally, students do activities and conduct research using the Internet.

Course Content:

In *FRENCH I*, students will learn concepts such as:

- Greetings, salutations and saying good-bye
- Talking about oneself and others
- Present Tense verb conjugations
- Basic Past Tense (*Passé Composé*)
- Possessive Adjectives
- Agreement of Nouns, Articles and Adjectives
- Introduction of vocabulary in thematic units
- Appreciation and understanding of French-speaking culture both in France and some of the 44 Francophone nations.

Examples:

Questions students should be able to answer upon completion of *FRENCH I*:

1. (parler) Nous français en classe.	2. C'est vrai. Tu raison.	
3. (noir)Ma mère a des chaussures	4. Write 5 sentences in the past tense describing your last trip to the movies.	

Workload Expectations:

- Students will be expected to spend an average of approximately <u>30 minutes to an hour</u> outside of class on homework for each class period.
- <u>French 1</u> maintains a pace of approximately <u>1 unit per month followed by a unit exam</u>.

Each semester will have approximately <u>6 tests</u> and <u>near daily quizzes</u>.

Other indicators of potential success in *FRENCH I* include:

- Success in another foreign language
- Willingness to speak and practice in order to learn a new language
