TPHS Course Profile

Japanese II

9-12th Grade (10 Credits)

Prerequisites: "C" or better in Japanese I



Description

This course is a beginning level course and should be attempted after a full year of Japanese I has been successfully completed. In this course students review some skills from Japanese I and acquire new skills in the areas of grammar, vocabulary, reading, writing, comprehension and culture. The lesson includes a series of linguistic activities and cultural topics that enable students to communicate in Japanese about daily activities at a functional level. Students will continue mastering the phonetic writing system, Hiragana and Katakana, and will learn approximately 70 additional Kanji.

Course Content:

Grammar:

• Verb conjugation (nai-form, masu-form, dictionary form, te-form), Adjective past tense, Location, Suggestion, Counting various objects, Qualifying nouns with verbs and adjectives, comparison

Vocabulary Topics:

- Nationalities
- Body Parts
- Clothing
- Trip
- Kabuki
- Sports
- Sickness/injury
- Ordering food

Reading Comprehension:

Read all Hiragana, Katakana, and basic Kanji, Understand acquired vocabulary and sentence structure, Answer comprehension questions regarding the reading

Writing Comprehension:

Write sentences and full paragraphs with 75% accuracy, Use grammar and vocabulary skills to write on various topics, Express opinions in writing, Write letters, Be able to write in the past and present tense.

Oral Communication:

Ask questions, with and without interrogatives, Express emotion, Express basic needs, Give basic commands, Describe at a basic level in present and past tenses, Tell what happened in the past, Comprehension instructions in Japanese, Comprehend short stories and conversation.

Workload expectations:

- Students are expected to spent at least an average of approximately 30 minutes to an hour outside the class on homework and review of notes and textbook content for each class period.
- Students are expected to participate actively as individuals in class and collaborate in groups.
- Students are expected to write a report once a month on various topics.

Assessment:

Assessment on this course measures what students know and are able to do (competence and performance). Students' progress in listening, speaking, reading and writing are based on:
