## TPHS Safety Overview

Torrey Pines High School is committed to ensuring the safety of students, staff and visitors, which is why we work closely with local law enforcement, District and County leadership, and our community to improve our practice and protocols. We annually update our comprehensive safety plan with input from SDPD, SDFD, and the [SDCOE](#). Administrators have been trained in the most recent best practices from law enforcement, and we conduct annual drills to ensure students and staff are prepared in the event of a crisis. Our staff receives regular updates from District safety meetings, and our site safety team meets monthly to address evolving needs. Whether it's a fire, an earthquake, police activity in our area, or an incident on campus, we are prepared to protect our students and. We need your help, so stay aware, stay connected, and stay informed.

## Say Something

Statistics show that the best way to keep everyone safe is when students and staff keep open lines of communication. During our annual Safe Schools week in the fall, we emphasize "see something, hear something, say something." The results of this program have been dramatic. Encourage your student to talk to a trusted adult or use an [anonymous Tip Line](#) when they have a concern. The sooner we know of an issue, the sooner we can work to keep everyone safe!

## Social Media

Social media was designed to help us better connect and collaborate, but instant access to rumor and speculation can often spread misinformation and fear. Social media can also create big problems for students when what seems like a joke among friends, turns out to be a life altering mistake. - **Secure Campus** - No immediate danger, students remain in class but instruction continues.
- **Lockdown** - Potential danger, all staff, students, and visitors proceed to nearest room/office, lock doors and close blinds.
- **Evacuation** - Students and staff proceed to designated safe areas outside of buildings.
